Recognising the specific needs of these families, Fisher House UK was built to offer them a crucial support system during difficult times. This 18-bedroom haven provides a "home away from home" for injured service members and their families, allowing them to stay close to loved ones while receiving treatment at the hospital. Many of these individuals have served in combat, and their injuries often require ongoing care.

Our hope is that, because this is a worthy cause:

- Military (& ex-mil) Personnel might want to help us keep us going and augment support for Fisher House
- There might be people in our network with local knowledge, so we can glean information to set more interesting tasks/challenges (for comedy value/masonic & military interest/promotional material)
- We could afford an opportunity for brethren, especially young/new masons to meet and befriend those from other provinces (5 of 9, etc)...
- ...serving as an opportunity to demonstrate/promote direct grass roots masonic activity, making a difference in our communities beyond our immediate masonic cohort...
- ... perhaps precipitating cross provincial visits/cooperation in future events
- We could provide a less formal environment to involve anyone interested in joining, where they can meet masons outside of the rooms or white table events, demonstrating what we do' beyond the square'
- It is also hoped brethren might have contacts to request limited practical support, e.g. access to the rooms to take photos, wash and brush up, general logistical support, etc whilst in a neighbouring Province's 'patch'.

The Rite, one of the oldest orders, consists of 33 degrees, of which the three degrees of Craft Freemasonry are accepted in lieu of the first three degrees of the Rite.
